

We recently picked this up at the library. My son is three, so stories with little text are still good for him, he always wants to turn the page if there is too much text. He likes that the story is a little scary. I do different voices for the big bad bullybug and the baby bugs, and tickle, pinch, or pretend scratch along with the story. We've made it very interactive, and there is a big squooshing sound I make when the tennis shoe squishes the big bad bullybug. This is great fun. We read it at the library with a little girl, who was about seven or eight, I would say, and she also liked it.

My 2 year old has all Ed Emberleys books memorized, he also insists on turning the last few pages back to the page where the Bully Bug is happiest and angriest, then he says "see you later" and we

close the book. Lots of fun, I think his best book if you only grab one.

My kids love the Big Green Monster, but this is so much cuter and clever! This quickly replaced it as my son's favorite. You have multiple perspectives (little bugs, monster bug, and a person - twist ending). Awesome book.

I am a teacher at a day care center. My kids are 16-24 months old. We have so much fun reading this interactive story. They love the bright colors and counting the eyes and teeth of big, bad bullybug. I do a big scary voice for the bullybug and a teeny voice for the baby bugs. They love it. They make the growling noises the bullybug makes along with me. There is a lot of laughter. We also use the book to discuss how we do not pinch, scratch, bite or stomp on our friends.

We bought all of Ed Emberley's books after serendipitously checking out 'Go Away Big Green Monster' from the library one day this summer. Bye-Bye, Big Bad Bullybug is also a great book. Great pictures, easy to follow story--our kids love his stuff.PS--if you like these books, I find the iPad app for GABGM to be FANTASTIC! Grab that if you like his work

I teach children the love of reading and this book has been a favorite. So much so that when I left one place I volunteered I had to leave a copy behind and now am the proud owner of another copy for my newest group.

I love all the books by this author, having first read "Go Away Monster" years ago. This is probably my favorite of all his books and my grandkids love to have it read to them.

This is one of the most popular books in our well stocked 2 year old's library. He loves how the Bullybug arrives, grows, and all the actions that go along with him as he grows. The book is very sturdy, with big thick pages that would withstand a lot of love from little fingers, even with the cut-outs. It's not really a good lesson on how to deal with bullies if you're looking for a book on that (the bug gets squished by a big foot that's friends with the little bitty baby bugs that are getting picked on) but it's fun and lighthearted and a good time. We don't find it scary at all.
